

Community College Admissions Process



To register for classes as early as possible, it's important for students to complete the following while meeting the community college's deadlines.

Step 1: Apply for Admission: Visit www.laccd.edu, or visit the college's website. Click on **APPLY NOW!** You will need your SSN if you have one. Once your application has been submitted, you will receive your College Student ID Number.

Tip #1: In the **Needs and Interests** section, be sure to check the box for **EOPS** (this program offers extended services for students who qualify).

Tip #2: If your goal is to transfer to a university, plan on completing your **Associates Degree** first. Visit www.ADegreeWithAGuarantee.com for more information.

Step 2: Complete the Orientation: Visit the community college's website and complete the online orientation; or, if required, make an appointment to meet with an admissions representative to complete the orientation in person. This will help familiarize yourself with the campus and support services offered to students.

Step 3: Complete the Assessment Process: All incoming students will be assessed in reading, writing, language usage, and mathematics to help select appropriate courses. Currently, this process includes reviewing transcripts – **assessment exams are no longer required.**

Step 4: Meet with an Academic Counselor: Success in College begins with creating a Student Educational Plan. The Counseling Department at the college you attend can help you with choosing a major, transferring to a university, career exploration, and general personal counseling. Before registering for classes, make an appointment to meet with a counselor. **Follow required procedures to remain eligible for the LA Promise Grant.**

Step 5: Register for Classes: Register for classes online on or after your registration appointment time. Before you log on, check the class schedule and make note of the name and section number of the courses you want to register for.
